“Unify to Glorify”

Sermon by Mitchum Burnett, January 21, 2006

“We don’t need to like each other, just LOVE each other”, said Brother M. Burnett in his sermon on **this year’s theme of the Westmount Church: “Unify to Glorify”**. Underlining the importance of unity in the house of God, he outlined the various positive outcomes that unity would bring to bear. He said, “as a result of unity, we can be able to glorify the lord in completeness”. He added, “with unity a church can do marvelous things – we would have a more receptive and pleasant environment wherein and would be delighted to worship.”

The young aspiring Pastor explained that contrary to popular belief; it is in fact much easier to love someone than to truly like them. Although we love certain individuals, we can easily indicate multiple things we don’t practically like about them. Thus it’s easier to love than to truly like. Bro. Burnett counseled that we should place emphasis on that love and that shall lead us on the path to unity.
